

## HAMPDEN TOWN WARRANT

### COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

COUNTY OF HAMPDEN

TOWN OF HAMPDEN

*To: Either of the Constables of the said Town of Hampden in said County:*

#### GREETING:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn all the inhabitants of the Town of Hampden qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to meet at the Hampden Elementary School, Hampden, on Monday, March 6, 1967 at eight o'clock in the evening, then and there to act on the following articles, viz.:

ARTICLE 1. To hear the Annual Reports of all the officers of the Town and any Committee whose duty it may be to report at said meeting, and act thereon.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to fix the salary and compensation of all elective officers of the Town as provided for by Section 108 of Chapter 41, General Laws, and to raise and appropriate the necessary sums to cover same; to raise money and make appropriations to defray the expenses of the Town for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3. To hear the report of the Hampden Development Committee and to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000 to be used by the Planning Board to prepare a definitive Town Plan, said sum of money to be used in conjunction with matching funds, if available, through the Housing Act of 1954, Title VII, Section 701, as amended.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the expenses of the Hampden Development Committee.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept the proposed revisions to Zoning By-laws for the Town of Hampden as set forth by the Planning Board Subcommittee on Zoning.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town of Hampden will vote to accept the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 8c as amended, and direct the Board of Selectmen to appoint a Conservation Commission for the promotion and development of the natural resources and for the protection of the watershed resources of said Town.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to have an Elementary School Building Committee appointed by the Board of Selectmen; said Committee to consist of five members, one of which shall be a member of the School Committee; this Committee to study the elementary school needs of the Town; and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for expenses of this Committee.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to abolish the elective office of Town Auditor.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum of money from the Overlay Reserve to the Reserve Fund.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury a sum of money to the Stabilization Fund.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the payment of any departmental bills of the year 1966 or previous years, from the 1967 appropriations.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be used to start a fund to defray expenses of Hampden's Centennial Celebration in 1978, said sum of money to be deposited in a separate savings account in a savings bank; the provisions of this article to be contingent upon the passage of an appropriate bill by the General Court.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following by-law:

"No person, except an officer of the law in the performance of his duties, shall enter upon the premises of another or upon any public or private property with the intention of peeping into the windows of a house or other building or of spying in any manner upon any person or persons therein."

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 2 of the "By-Laws for the Town of Hampden, Massachusetts" so that in the future it shall read, "The annual Business meeting shall be held on the first Monday in March at 8 o'clock P.M., and the warrants for all Town Meetings shall be posted on the bulletin boards in the Town House, at the intersection of Main Street and Somers Road, at the Town Line on Allen Street, at the intersection of Scantic and Glendale Roads and at the entrance to Hampden Memorial Park at least seven days before town meeting."

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ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following by-law:

"No person, not licensed to do so, shall keep, store or park any motor vehicle or vehicles, as defined in the General Laws, which are required to be registered in order to be operated upon the ways of the Commonwealth, if said vehicles are unregistered, whether assembled or disassembled; on any premises within the Town, if visible from any street or way, unless stored within an enclosed building, without an annual permit from the Chief of Police.

Such annual permits may be issued by the Chief of Police in his discretion for what he considers justifiable cause and subject to such reasonable conditions as he may impose thereon.

This by-law shall not apply to vehicles used for farming purposes.

Violations of this by-law shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars."

ARTICLE 16. To see what disposition the Town will make of the Dog Fund, now in the hands of the Treasurer.

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue for the financial years beginning January 1, 1967 and January 1, 1968 in accordance with provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4, and to renew any note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year, in accordance with the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used for repairing the exterior and remodeling the interior of the Town House into Town Offices, a Police Department Headquarters, hearing rooms, larger quarters for the Hampden Free Public Library.

ARTICLE 19. To see what action the Town will take with respect to the land now being used for dumping purposes on Cross Road, Hampden; which land is owned by William P. Patullo and Charles R. Melville.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the repair and maintenance of Town roads and instruct the Selectmen to petition and contract with the Commissioners of the Department of Public Works, under the provisions of Chapter 81, Section 26 of the General Laws.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in conjunction with any money which may be allotted by the State or County, or both, for Chapter 90 Maintenance, and instruct the Selectmen to petition and contract with the Commissioners of the Department of Public Works and the Commissioners of Hampden County, under the provisions of Chapter 90, Section 34.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in conjunction with any money which may be allotted by the State or County, or both, for the widening and surfacing of a portion of Main Street, and instruct the Selectmen to petition and contract with the Commissioners of the Department of Public Works and the Commissioners of Hampden County, under the provisions of Chapter 90, Section 34.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from unappropriated available funds in the Treasury a sum of money for the State share of Chapter 81 and the State and County share of Chapter 90 Highway programs.

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 679 of the Acts of 1965 and the grant to the Town of Hampden in the amount of \$6,852.69 to be used for highway purposes.

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to use the State grant of \$6,852.69 in conjunction with money already appropriated by the Town for relocation, widening and surfacing of a portion of Main Street.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for required surveys and erection of speed zone signs on Main Street, East Longmeadow Road, Allen Street, Wilbraham Road, and Somers Road.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,500 to be used in conjunction with Chapter 90 money for the repair and resurfacing of a portion of Main Street.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, will vote to have the Town Clerk elected for a period of three (3) years, starting with the Town Election of 1968.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, will vote to have the Tax Collector elected for a period of three (3) years, starting with the Town Election of 1968.

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, will vote to have the Town Treasurer elected for a period of three (3) years, starting with the Town Election of 1968.

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 2 "Town Meetings" of the "By-Laws for the Town of Hampden, Massachusetts" so that in the future it shall read, "The number of voters to constitute a quorum shall be 75."

ARTICLE 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to defray one-half the cost of health insurance for full-time Town employees.

And you are further required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hampden qualified to vote in elections of Town Officers to meet at the Town House on Monday, the thirteenth of March, A.D. 1967 at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to give in their votes on one ballot to the election officers of said Town for the following officers, to wit:

To choose for the term of one year the following: One Moderator, one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Collector of Taxes, one Tree Warden, one Auditor and one member of the Board of Park Commissioners.

To choose for the term of two years the following: Two members of the Board of Park Commissioners.

To choose for the term of three years the following: One Selectman, who shall also be on the Board of Public Welfare; one Assessor, one School Committee member, one Library Trustee, one Cemetery Commissioner, two members of the Board of Park Commissioners.

To choose for the term of five years the following: One member of the Planning Board.

Also to choose all other necessary Town Officers.

Also to vote on the following question: "Shall certain provisions of Chapter thirty-two B of the General Laws, authorizing any county, city, town or district to provide a plan of contributory group life insurance, group accidental death and dismemberment insurance, and group general or blanket hospital, surgical and medical insurance for certain persons in the service of such county, city, town or district and their dependents, be accepted by this town?"

The polls shall be open at 10 A.M. and shall close at 8 P.M.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at each of the three places designated by the Town. Hereof fail not, and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk at or before the time of meeting aforesaid.
