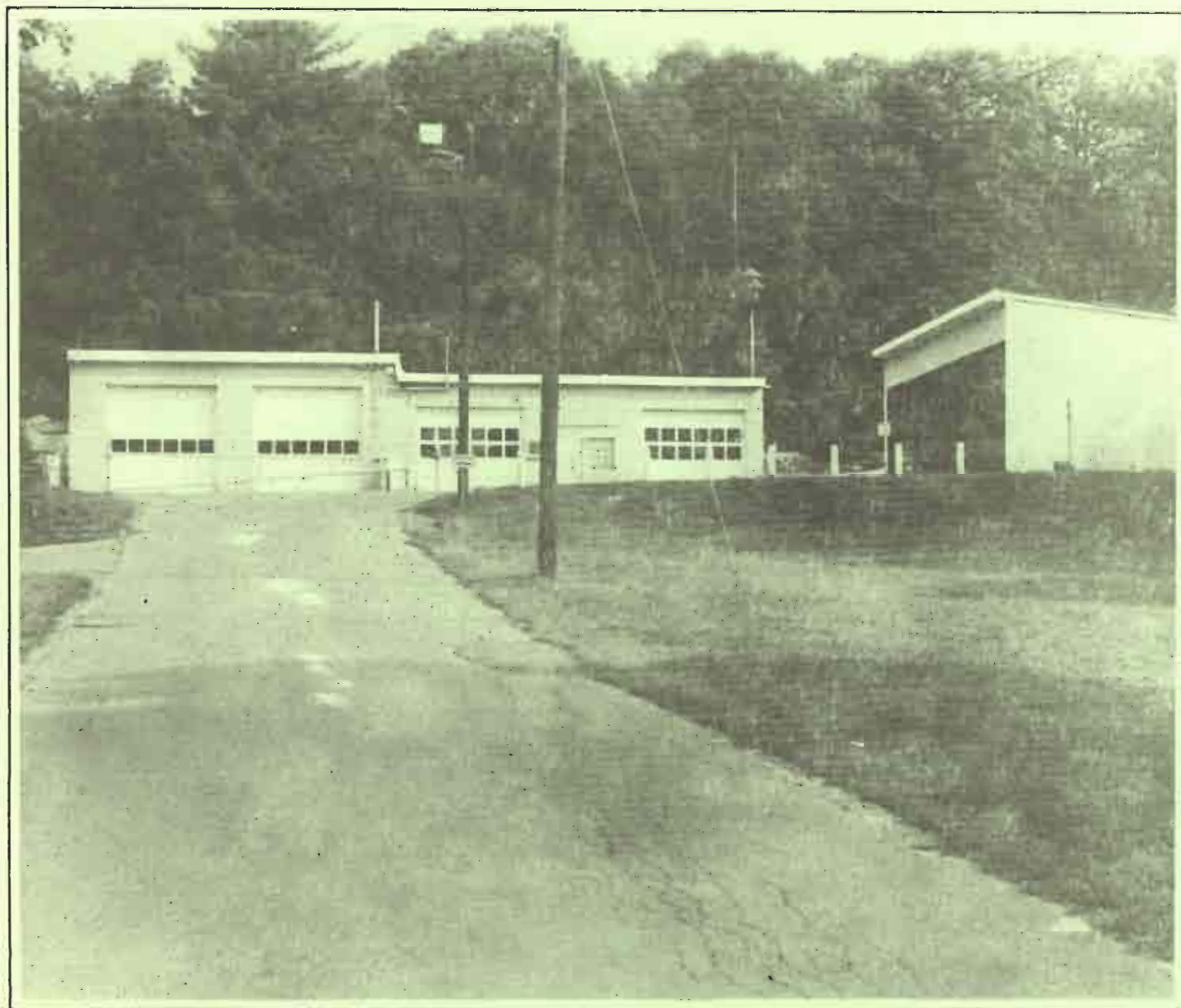

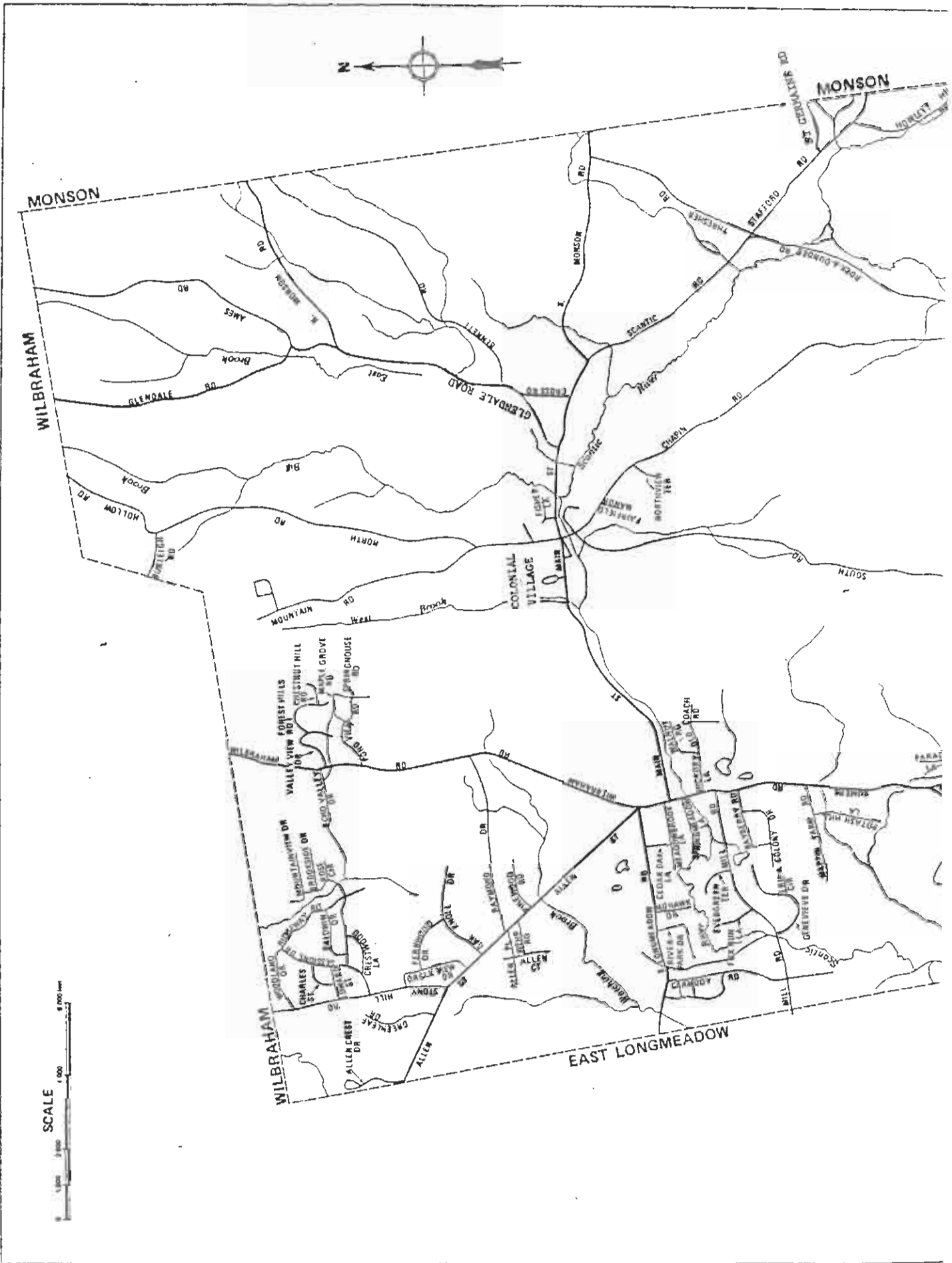

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING -- Thornton W. Burgess School, Hampden

April 25, 1988

Moderator, Dalton Philpott opened the meeting at 8:00 PM.

Article 1. The Town voted that the annual reports, as contained in the Annual Town Report for the year 1987 be accepted as printed.

Article 2. The Town voted that the sums of money shown in the column entitled fiscal 1989 recommended of the of the Hampden Advisory Committee be granted and appropriated as amended for the specific purposes designated and that the same be expended only for such purposes, each number being considered a separate appropriation and that the Town raise and appropriate such sums as may be required to defray said charges for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

Article 2A. The Town voted that budget items 60.0 through 69.0 be considered first. These items were subsequently reconsidered.

Article 4. Chapter 131, Section 40, may be used to meet the area and yard requirements for the district or districts in which the remainder of the lot is situated (provided the proposed construction site be a non-wetland or non-flood plain area of at least 75% of the minimum lot area requirements).

Add new Section 6.7.2.5: Where the bounds are in doubt, the burden of proof shall be upon the owner(s) of the land in question, to show where they should be properly located. However, the Town of Hampden retains its authority to determine the actual boundaries of the flood plain/wetland within the area in question.
